### Objectives & Content

The course aims to familiarize students with corporate sustainability and citizenship and analyze the key drivers and challenges influencing MNEs' adoption of sustainable business practices and performance. To this end, the course explores the role of multinational enterprises (MNEs) in fostering sustainable development and global citizenship within contemporary global business practices and challenges. Students will learn about the growing responsibilities of international firms towards society and the environment, considering the interconnectedness of environmental, social, and governance (ESG) challenges on a global scale.

Through case studies, discussions, and interactive learning activities, students will analyze the nonmarket strategies and practices adopted by MNEs to address sustainability issues and contribute to positive social and environmental impact worldwide. Emphasis will be placed on understanding the complexities of corporate citizenship, stakeholder engagement, ethical decision-making, and integrating sustainability principles into core business operations across various industries and geographical contexts. The course adopts a learning method based on lectures, active student interaction, case study analysis, guest speakers, and assignments.

## Course Policies

The course has “prüfungsimmanenten Charakter”. Attendance is compulsory throughout the semester. More than 25% of absence will automatically result in a “fail” grade.

Both the course and the assessments will be in English. During the course active participation is required during all lessons.

Students wishing to take this course must register via u:find/u:space (with points) during the registration period. The maximum number of participants is 24.

Registered students who, for whatever reason, are not able to take the course must de-register electronically by the 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025. Students who decide to drop the course after this deadline will be graded with 5 (failed).

## Course Structure

Lectures take place on Thursdays from 3.00 pm till 4.30 pm – **except** 13<sup>th</sup> November, 4<sup>th</sup> December, 15<sup>th</sup> January and 22<sup>nd</sup> January from 3.00 pm – 6.15 pm. Details of the course syllabus will be discussed in the first session.

## Assessment

The evaluation is structured as follows:

- Active class participation (10%)
- Mid-term quiz (20%)
- Group case study project (30%)
- Final written exam (40%)

The use of AI tools (e.g. ChatGPT) for the production of texts is prohibited and only permitted if they are expressly requested by the course leader (e.g. for individual work tasks).

The exam will include all the discussed topics during lectures.

A minimum of 50 percent of the points needs to be attained overall to pass the course. The grading system is as follows:
